***Truthfulness Inquiries: Choose at least one of the following***

Identify and list at least five quotations containing the word 'truth' or 'truthfulness'. Write a fable (a short story, told with animal characters, intended to teach a moral lesson) about truth. Choose one of the quotations as the moral of the story. Read or have it read to the class. (L)

Investigate/research two or more famous people or leaders from businesses who have lied to the public and only admitted wrongdoing after they were caught. Investigate/research two or more famous people or leaders from businesses who told the truth even when they knew it might damage their image/business. Write a news report comparing and contrasting the reactions of the public to the two different situations. Create a mock newspaper OR videotape a mock 'newscast' and present it to the class. (L, BK) *(Can be done with ONE (1) other classmate...)*

Create a visual (poster, collage, mobile, etc) that demonstrates truthfulness or lack of truthfulness in **advertising**. Analyze in writing each ad for the hidden message and why or why not the ad is being truthful. Summarize why you think advertising uses truth in such a way. (LM, Sp)

Create/alter a familiar song that describes the essential elements of truthfulness. Record on audio cassette or perform for the class. (A, L)

***Trustworthiness Inquiries: Choose at least one of the following***

Select at least five cartoons from a newspaper, magazine or other source which show trustworthiness. On a poster board or scanned into a document or powerpoint, explain in writing your reasons for selecting them and *why* they show/demonstrate trustworthiness. (Sp)

Create/alter a familiar song that describes the essential elements of Trustworthiness. Record on audio cassette or perform for the class. (A, L)

Change the word 'love' to 'trust' in a familiar love song. Sing it for the class or record on an audio cassette. (A, L)

Write a poem or song that describes how you would feel if no one trusted you or you did not trust others. Read (or have read) or perform for the class. (L)
