Countries and Territories

Label the following countries and territories using all capitals.

United States

Greenland (territory of DENMARK)

(Note: More correctly called Kalaallit Nunaat; its capital is Nuuk)

St. Pierre and Miquelon (Territory of FRANCE)

Canadian Provinces/Territories and Cities

Shade and neatly label each province/territory in all capitals. Mark the provincial capitals of each province with a dot or star and label beginning with a capital, followed by lower case letters.

**Ottawa is the Federal Capital of Canada; provincial capitals are in parenthesis.*

Nunavut (Iqaluit) - A relatively new territory, recognized in 1999, carved out of Canada's Central and Eastern Arctic. Divide the Northwest Territories into Eastern and Western portions, and the Eastern portion, including Hudson's Bay and Baffin Island, is Nunavut. In the Inuit language of Inuktitut, Nunavut means "Our Land;" this new territory, about 350,000 square miles or 1/5 the area of Canada, has been established as a homeland for Canada's First Peoples.
